Welcome to St Botolph's - whether you are with us in church or following online - for our Parish Carol Service, which is led by the Rector, Fr David Armstrong. This is one of our major annual celebrations, and allows us to include and thank the wider St Botolph's 'family' and our linked charities and organisations.



We are greatly appreciative of our links with the **City civic, historic** and commercial: many local firms come to this carol service; there are representatives here today of other City organisations including the City Heritage Society, the Bishopsgate Institute and Central Foundation Schools, both founded from this parish; and U3A Dagenham. The Ward of Bishopsgate is represented by some of the Common Councillors: one of whom, Tom Sleigh CC, is reading the first lesson.

We welcome representatives of our linked Livery Companies, particularly today the Coopers' Company, whose Master, Mr John Fahy, is reading a lesson. Our thanks also to **The Coopers' Company and Coborn School:** to Ms Sue Hay, Headteacher, to Miss Alexi Williams, Head of Music and her staff including choir director Ms Karis White, and to the choir, for giving up their time to join us today in a very busy week in the School's calendar. This year they are once again working alongside our own choir, and both choirs are accompanied by Iestyn Evans, St Botolph's Organist and Director of Music.

The other readers show other aspects of the work and contacts of a busy City church: Jane Brightwell represents our neighbours and friends at the Andaz Hotel (who are now in a new partnership with St Botolph's and the Coopers' Company to support our local homeless community), and Detective Sergeant Rebecca Conran works for the City Police at Bishopsgate Police Station – who are also our partners in our work with the Homeless Hub. Fr Andrew Williams is our Priest Missioner, and Vicar of our partner church St Francis at the Engine Room, Tottenham; and friend of St Botolph's Fr Toby Thomas is one of several visiting priests who helps us with services.

St Botolph's Advent & Christmas Charities

Alms given and collections taken during Advent and at Carol Services are divided between our chosen charities, which this year reflect two issues particularly relevant to our Advent theme of 'The Outcast'.

PROVIDENCE ROW Providence Row has been working since 1860 with all sectors HELPING HOMELESS AND VULNERABLE PEOPLE SINCE 1860 of the homeless population

Tower Hamlets and the City of London, including those turned away from other projects due to their special needs. The charity works with more than 1800 homeless and vulnerably housed people a year, offering an integrated service of crisis support, advice, recovery, and learning and training programmes. The Dellow Day Centre provides essential services including food, showers and laundry facilities, which help to restore health and dignity, and the charity's wide range of advice support and outreach services also help to tackle the more complex issues which may be the root cause of a person's homelessness.

ABCD Bethlehem is a UK charity which has worked for nearly 40 years in partnership supporting organisations disabled children in hospitals and refugee camps in the West Bank. The children and their



families cared for by ABCD's partners were already in great need of help, but the devastating conflict in Gaza has had a further huge impact on their lives. With Palestinian areas of the West Bank in lockdown and suffering nightly raids, the psychological damage to children and young adults is incalculable. Your donations will go towards ABCD's crisis appeal to meet the needs of hundreds of vulnerable children in refugee camp centres by providing additional trauma therapy, support for families with food parcels and medication, and urgent repairs to centres damaged in the conflict.

Please give as generously as you are able at this time:

- Cash donations may be placed in the alms boxes, or handed to a member of staff at any time. If you are a UK taxpayer please complete a Gift Aid envelope so we can claim back a further 25% from HMRC.
- Card/contactless donations can be made at any time via the devices at the front or back of church, or this dedicated QR code, and can be Gift Aided.
- Credit card donations can be made via the link on our website, and can be Gift Aided.
