



The UK charity Action around Bethlehem Children with Disability (ABCD Bethlehem) works tirelessly to support the needs of disabled children and young adults, and their families in the West Bank. ABCD's rehabilitation centre in Nour Shams has twice


recently been ransacked by government forces; the charity has undertaken to refurbish and restock this centre and to continue to support the children and families it serves. St Botolph's has supported ABCD for some years, and the collection at the Patronal Festival Mass will go towards the emergency appeal for the refurbishment at Nour Shams.

The service will be followed by the traditional **Parish Party** at which the refreshments will include food with a Palestinian inspiration. There will as usual be a special **St Botolph Cake** created by our friend John Marshall.
